About the presenters



Janine Shelby, Ph.D., RPT-S is an Assistant Professor in the Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA. She is the Director of Child Psychology Training and the Child Trauma Clinic at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. In the Association for Play Therapy, Dr. Shelby has served as President of the Foundation and President of the California Branch of APT. Dr. Shelby's academic work focuses on the use of developmentally sensitive intervention methods for traumatized children. She has provided trauma-related training and humanitarian aid in more than 15 countries, and has served as a consult for the National Center for Child Traumatic Stress, Operation USA, Doctors of the World, and several humanitarian aid organizations.



Toni Zimmerman, Ph.D., is a Professor at Colorado State University. She is the Program Director of the Marriage and Family Therapy, Department of Human Development and Family Studies, at Colorado State University. Toni's research is primarily in three areas; work and family balance, diversity training with youth (the FAIR curriculum), and analysis of relationship advice in the popular media. Toni is an excellent teacher who has been recognized for her enthusiasm and rigor in her teaching especially with respect to diversity training. She recently was on the faculty with the University of Virginia study abroad program Semester at Sea, which visited countries such as South Africa, India, China, Vietnam, Japan, Brazil, Hong Kong, Malaysia, and Mauritius, where she taught courses on family, sexuality, and gender.

About Dr. Shelby's Workshop

In this presentation, attendees will learn dozens of practical, engaging, and research based strategies to help them provide posttraumatic treatments to children and adolescents. The presenter will review research-based methods, discuss the components of each method, and explore various ways in which standard treatments can be blended with play-based, engaging techniques so that the treatments are maximally effective, interesting, and developmentally appropriate. The discussion will be framed across 4 areas of development, and will feature discussion of coping, cognitive skills, and interventions particular to each developmental stage. The presentation will be delivered using didactic methods, supplemented liberally with experiential activities, role-play, media clips, and demonstration activities.
