

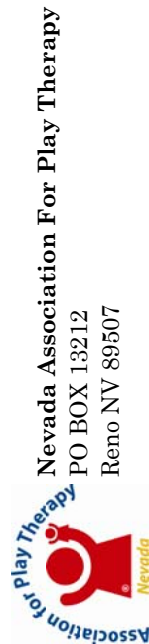
About the NVAPT Board

Board Positions

President

NVAPT is looking for an enthusiastic, motivated and driven person to help NVAPT continue to grow. The president must ensure that NVAPT will comply with the standards set forth by the APT charter branch agreement. The president will be dedicated to increasing membership, play therapy promotions, workshops and member outreach. The president will facilitate the search for presenters in both the southern and northern regions of the state. The president will also attend the APT annual conference's business meeting. The president will also work closely with the vice president to ensure NVAPT's growth in the 2008/2010 year.

Vice President (President elect for the 2009/2010 year)

The vice president/president elect will be the president for the following election year. The vice president will plan and coordinate the annual conference and aid the president in complying with the APT charter branch agreement. The vice president will solicit vendors for the annual conference and organize raffle prizes.

Secretary

The secretary is responsible for all continuing education credit applications for workshops and conferences. The secretary is also responsible for ensuring that NVAPT's provider numbers are up to date and current. The secretary must attend all branch meetings and the annual branch business meeting to record minutes. The secretary will type up notes from the

meetings and send them, via email, to other board members.

Treasurer

This person would most likely attend all workshops etc. to help with paperwork, logistics etc. This person may solicit other NVAPT members to serve as part of the membership committee to aid in these responsibilities.

Northern Membership Committee Chair

The northern membership committee chair is responsible for recruiting members to NVAPT from their region (Reno/Sparks). The chair would help with workshops, events, or promotions in their area. This person would most likely attend all workshops etc. to help with paperwork, logistics etc. This person may solicit other NVAPT members to serve as part of the membership committee to aid in these responsibilities.

Rural Outreach Coordinator

The rural outreach coordinator is responsible for recruiting members to NVAPT from their region (rural Nevada). The coordinator would

help with workshops, events, or promotions in their area. This person would most likely attend all workshops etc. to help with paperwork, logistics etc.

Southern Student Representative
